

Strategy Scoping Document: Supply and Quality Workstreams

The council has been reviewing its homelessness and housing strategies. The council's new housing strategy will be made up of 3 workstreams:

- Homelessness and rough sleeping
- Increasing supply of accommodation
- Improving the quality of housing and neighbourhoods

The council adopted its new homelessness and rough sleeping strategy in December 2019, which sets out some of the housing needs we will be addressing through the supply and quality workstreams.

We have been working with our partners to scope the supply and quality workstreams, some of the priorities we have already identified are set out below. These priorities will be included in the supply and quality workstreams, which will be adopted later in 2020.
