

Revised Scoping Report – Background Paper 2 – Baseline Information

August 2011

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 Background Paper 2 forms part of the Council's duty to undertake a Sustainability Appraisal (SA) and Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) of the Hastings Local Development Framework (LDF). It contains all the baseline information needed to ensure that the social, economic and environmental effects of the Hastings LDF can be effectively predicted and monitored.
- 1.2 This background paper should be read together with the Revised Scoping Report and Background Paper 1 – Policy Review, both of which are available to view or download from our website at http://www.hastings.gov.uk/environment_planning/planning/local_development_framework/ldf_documents. Alternatively, copies can be made available on request by contacting our office on the details below.
- 1.3 The 2005 Scoping Report contained an earlier version of the baseline matrix, which was first updated in 2008, and again in 2011. It was also refined to take account of changing government guidance, and to focus on those issues and indicators most relevant to Hastings. It is therefore, not an exhaustive review of all available baseline information but rather a “fit for purpose” review that is suitable in the context of the Hastings Local Development Framework.
- 1.4 We will keep this matrix under review, and update as necessary.
